Our story begins with love in the heart of a perfect summer.






Colour in Rama and Sita's wedding with crayons, paint, glitter and anything else you can think of!

Banished from their kingdom, they stood tall and brave!








#### A GOLDEN DEER


A golden deer, beautiful and bright, attracted our friends with all of its might. Little did they know, the trickery of Ravan....




1. First draw an almond shape for the deers head.




2. Add two lines down from the head to draw the neck.




3. Add a shape to the neck to create the body.




4. Add four legs to the body. Two at the front and two behind.

6. And finally add some hooves, an eye, and little black nose.






Draw your very own beautiful golden deer in this forest. Use pencils, pens, paints or glitter and make it shine bright!

Ready for battle to save Sita from despair.


- Glue the next page to some cardboard to make it stronger.


