Leicester's largest and perhaps least known park. The park has over 100 hectares of grassland and woodland. There are two scheduled monuments in the park. The Castle Hill earthworks, associated with the Knights Hospitaller and King Williams bridge: an old pack horse bridge which spans the Rothley Brook.

Led by a Parks Officer, the walk provides an insight into the park's history and development, with reference to site archaeology, landscape features and woodland management over the years. Including reference to earlier medieval deer parks and development of the historic Beaumont Leys Estate.

The walk also provides an insight into modern day park management, recent conservation and heritage initiatives and on-going environmental improvement works, many carried out in partnership with Leicester Environmental Volunteers.

The walk route incorporates gravelled tracks, mown paths and woodland trails, with some slopes.

The walk lasts approximately 3 hours. Max 12 people.






