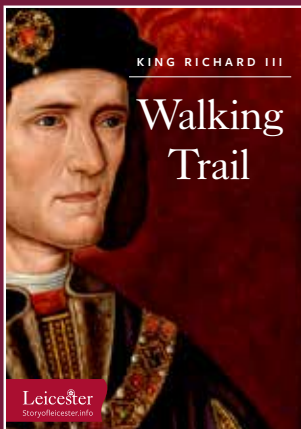


King Richard III Walking Trail

Fact, Fiction and the Portraits of Richard III

'Determined to prove a villain': Fact, Fiction and the Portraits of Richard III. As part of the National Portrait Gallery's COMING HOME project Dr Charlotte Bolland, Senior Curator, Research and 16th Century collections, will talk about the Gallery's iconic portrait of Richard III.

Created in the late sixteenth century as a means of illustrating the lineage and legitimacy of the Tudor dynasty, the portrait was one of the earliest gifts to the Gallery. Since then, encountered by countless visitors on the Gallery walls, it has sparked consideration of Richard's reputation: is he Shakespeare's villain, or the much-maligned victim of a Tudor smear campaign?

The House of Bayard represent a 15th Century French household on loan from the King of France to the Lancastrian cause (Henry Tudor) during the Wars of the Roses and will be portraying a medieval military camp for the weekend.

They have built up a good reputation over the years for their living history camp with plenty of public interaction and have won many competitions for it. Their medieval camp (complete with their own period bread oven) includes archers, men at arms.

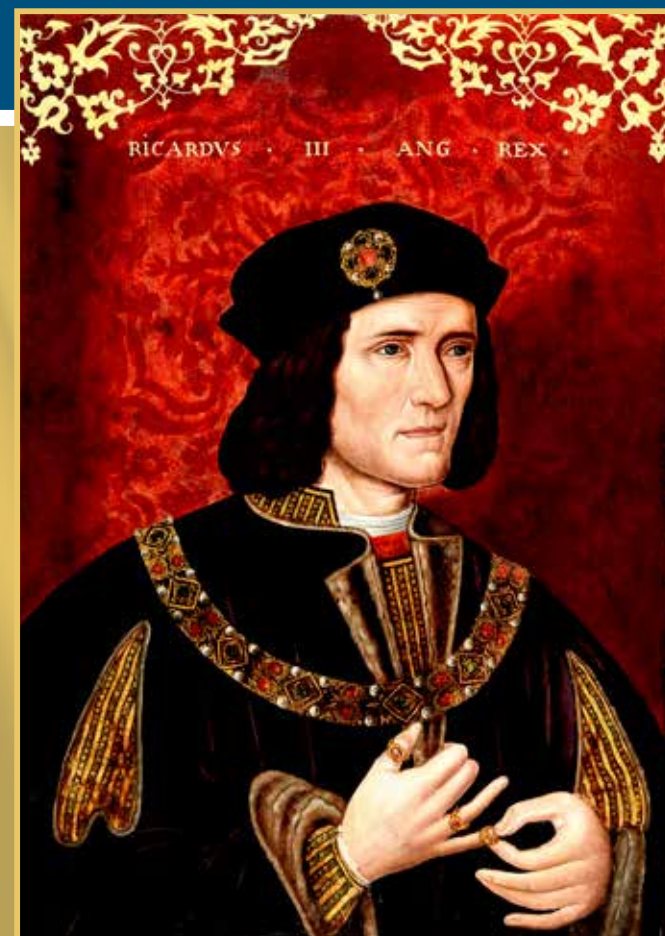

The award-winning King Richard III Visitor Centre was created around the car park where the King's remains were buried for over 500 years.

Using great storytelling, beautiful design and 21st century technology, the centre tells the incredible story of the King's life and death, revealing one of the greatest archaeological detective stories ever told. Visitors can experience the sights and sounds of medieval battle; follow the Dig

Diary and see a 3D replica of King Richard III's skeleton that clearly shows his curved spine, as well as his battle injuries.

The experience is completed with a visit to the site of King Richard's original burial, preserved in a quiet, respectful setting and with a contemplative atmosphere.

Leicester Cathedral King Richard III's tomb is open to visitors

King Richard III's reinterment took place in 2004 at Leicester Cathedral and the ambulatory houses the tomb of King Richard III below which the mortal remains rest. The tomb, and space around it, was designed to allow the public a personal encounter with King Richard III's final resting place and to also present an opportunity to reflect upon the complexities of life and death.

St Katharine's Chapel houses The Redemption Windows designed by Thomas Denny, installed in April 2016 showing people, places and themes relating to the life and death of King Richard III. Daily guided 30 minute tours Mon-Sat 11am, 11am, 12pm, 2pm & 3pm. Please check website for closures.

The Richard III Portrait from the National Portrait Gallery

8 June – 22 September 2019 at New Walk Museum and Art Gallery

One of the most popular portraits in the National Portrait Gallery collection, the iconic portrait of King Richard III is on display at New Walk Museum and Art Gallery as part of the national COMING HOME project. Working in partnership with the King Richard III Visitor Centre and Leicester Cathedral, the exhibition explores the story

of King Richard III and his famous rediscovery in a Leicester car park.

Bosworth Battlefield Heritage Centre tells the dramatic story of the Battle of Bosworth on Monday 22 August 1485, which marked a major turning point in English history.

Explore the interactive exhibition to discover more about the battle where Richard III fought for his crown and lost his life to Henry Tudor's army. Have a chance to vote for whom you think was the better king and see how archaeologists rediscovered the true location of the Battlefield, with displays of the unique objects that were unearthed.

With interactive, hands-on activities, including guided walks and re-enactments throughout the year, you can find out about the Wars of the Roses, how the battle unfolded and the impact of the Tudor dynasty on England.
