





Led by Vehicle Arts, you may have been lucky enough to spot their 2022 project, bringing unique artworks to city centre locations. The We Are Leicester trail called Up Your Street joins us with a whole host of 10 totally new artworks exhibited for the first time.

Focussing on the theme of 'Unity' the trail celebrates Leicester's rich diversity. Five artists have collaborated with five local communities to create a piece

together and a second produced by the artists inspired by the groups. Leicester's communities are celebrated in each of these artworks, so for locals and visitors from further afield it's not to be missed. Follow the trail and look for hidden clues in each with an opportunity to win an art prize by visiting them all.






Street Food

You'll be surprised that you're still in the heart of the midlands with South Asian vendors, Caribbean cooking, Polish Kielbesta, classic British grub, fresh Thai street food, traditional Greek dishes and stone baked pizza. And that's not even mentioning the sweet treats on offer, so be sure to leave room for dessert. Stalls will be catering for vegan and vegetarians, with some offering gluten free options with allergy advice from each stall holder possible.

Art in Health

Join Bright Sparks Arts in Health for Uplifted, a celebration of how arts and creativity can support our mental and physical health. BrightSparks' showcase of comedy, music, visual arts and dance will dazzle, delight and uplift you.

Performances from Rob Gee and the Comedy Asylum, the Bridge Choir, led by Luke Broughton, Showcase and the Smoothie Crew, plus Word! with Shruti Chauhan. Find out how dance is helping people with Parkinson's and patients at Leicester's hospitals. Bring the family for arts, crafts and dance workshops and wonderful performances of anything from Mozart to Metallica from violinist Adrian Garratt.

Opal22 will be offering families a free family portrait and encouraging diverse families of Leicester to wear their finest cultural garments for a day of celebration. Sport your traditional clothing with pride and represent your unique individual cultures. Families will receive a free digital picture sent via email. This is part of the Casta event series, with the Casta exhibition launching on the 17 September at Leicester Museum & Art Gallery.





The River

Running right through the heart of the festival is the River Soar's Mile Straight.

For those wanting to get close to the action, you can splash about in a kayak with Paddle Plus or take a boat trip with Sileby Boat Mill.

Local disability charity Mosaic will also be there with Sunbeam II, their fully accessible boat. For others wanting to stay a little drier, take a stroll down the tow path to check out the trade boats that will be joining us for the weekend. Keep an eye out for the Sea Cadets demos and Leicestershire Fire and Rescue displays.

Canal & River Trust

We care for a 2,000-mile-long, 200year-old network of canals, rivers, reservoirs and docks because we believe that life is better by water.

We know that spending time by water, whether it be your lunch break, daily commute or just a weekend stroll, really can make us feel happier and healthier. The Canal & River Trust will be bringing one of their workboats – step aboard and hear about year-round jobs they get up to on the water.












