


Focus Activity Sheet 1

Medieval Cookery Demo Ingredients



Butter

- 200ml Cream
- Pinch of salt

Gingerbread

- 300ml Honey
- 450g Bread, ground into Breadcrumbs
 - 1tsp Cinnamon
 - 1tsp Black Pepper
 - 4tsp Ginger Powder

Apple Fritters

- As much as you want Apple (dry or fresh – cored and sliced)
 - 300g Flour
- 50ml Ale (can use milk and eggs as a substitute)
 - Sugar for dusting

Bread

- 450g Flour
- 50g Cornflour
 - Pinch Salt
 - 7g Yeast
- 100ml Water (add a little at a time till it binds)
- 100ml Ale (add a little at a time till it binds)
 - 1tsp Honey
