Leicester Riverside Festival

Saturday 1 June 12noon – 6pm Sunday 2 June 12noon – 5pm Bede Park, Western Boulevard, River Soar, Castle Gardens & DMU Campus

One of Leicester's biggest free festivals celebrates its 25th Anniversary, with fun on and off the water. Activities at Bede Park, Western Boulevard, Castle Gardens, the River Soar and new for this year, the DMU Campus.

Keep an eye out for highlights on the river including colourful boats from across the region and demonstrations, and boat trips.

After 20 years, Leicester Mela Festival returns to Abbey Park. With two days of live music, dance, food, fashion, South Asian culture and more!


